

STEM at Summit Park Elementary School by Joyce Brown

STEM at SPES has been moving along steadily toward the end of its 9th year. We have exceeded 70 coaches. One of our coaches, Maureen Liburd, was burned out in the early morning fire at Hickory Houses on Route 45 across the street from St. Joseph's Catholic Church. She escaped with her life, purse, passport and pajamas. Coaches are sending money cards addressed to Maureen Liburd. We are collecting them at the school. Rita Garner (AAUW), Bert Singer, and Sondra Gordon (AAUW) are dealing with health issues.

On Thursday, April 6, 2017, the program presented its annual *Family Math Night*. Starting with a delicious dinner of meatballs over rice, salad and bread, ending with a tremendous variety of desserts, approximately 250 people braved torrential rain with lightning to visit 15 activities in the gyms. Volunteers numbering 35 attended: 7 from AAUW, 7 coaches from the program, 10 from RSVP, 6 from Spring Valley Rotary, 2 from Rockland Community College and 10 from the Ramapo High School Honor Society. Several will return in the fall as coaches.

An invitation is extended to AAUW members to attend our End-Of-Year Luncheon to be held at the School on Wednesday, May 24, 2017, at 11:30 a.m. at the school in the front gym. That is our final day of program for this year.

LAF (LEGAL ADVOCACY FUND)

In May 2014, the Massachusetts Commission against Discrimination (MCAD) upheld a ruling in favor of LuLu Su n in her gender and race discrimination case against the University of Massachusetts, Dartmouth. In June 2011 an MCAD hearing officer concluded that the university had violated Massachusetts' anti-discrimination laws and ordered the university to 1) promote Sun with retroactive back pay, 2) pay \$200,000 in emotional distress damages, plus 12% interest from the date the complaint was filed, 3) pay the commonwealth of Massachusetts a \$10,000 civil penalty, and 4) conduct an anti-discrimination training for its human resources staff, the dean of the UMass Dartmouth College of Arts and Sciences, the provost, and the chancellor. The university promoted her to full professor but appealed the emotional distress award, the civil penalty and the anti-discriminatory training. The most recent ruling upheld the MCAD hearing officer's decision and the university conceded any further appeal. AAUW is proud to have supported Sun's case and congratulate her on this final ruling.

EQUAL PAY DAY, April 4

As the 115th Congress begins, women working full time in the United States are typically paid just 80% of what men are paid, a gap of 20%. The pay gap is even larger for women of color, especially for Hispanic and Latina women, who were paid only 54% of what white men were paid in 2015. It is imperative that federal action is taken to support pay equity. The Equal Pay Act of 1963 prohibits pay discrimination on the basis of sex. While this crucial law has helped to narrow the gender pay gap, disparities persist. Congress must pass a comprehensive update to this bill to close existing loopholes, including deterring discrimination by strengthening penalties for equal pay violations and prohibiting retaliation against workers who inquire about employer's wage practices or disclose their own wages. An updated bill should also create incentives for employers to follow the law, empower women to negotiate for equal pay and strengthen federal outreach and enforcement efforts. While Congress is on break, tell your Congress members to support strong, effective legislation to close the gender pay gap - not faux fair pay bills.
