LEGAL ADVOCACY FUND (LAF)

<u>Appeals Court Blocks Unconstitutional Abortion Restriction in North Dakota.</u> In late July, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 8th Circuit struck down a North Dakota law that would have banned all abortions after approximately six weeks of pregnancy – arguably the most severe abortion restriction in the country. The 8th Circuit ruled that the law was unconstitutional under *Roe v Wade*. Although the court's ruling means that the law will not go into effect for now, North Dakota may appeal the court's decision to the U.S. Supreme Court. Even if the state doesn't do so, challenges to similar early bans look likely to reach the Supreme Court next term.
