STEM

STEM at Summit Park Elementary School is a math and reading coaching program where volunteer coaches in both subjects work one or more days per week with individuals or pairs of students to promote academic success. The program utilizes special lowkey strategies to promote the success of students, especially girls, to enable them to successfully choose careers in the fields of Science, Technology Engineering and Math. Coaches come from AAUW, RSVP, Rockland Retired Teachers' Center, friends of coaches and other organizations with similar goals. The primary qualification is that coaches love reading and/or math and that they are willing to share that love. The program works collaboratively with the East Ramapo School District to provide a solid foundation. The program now involves 50 coaches supporting grades 1 through 3 in reading and math. Service days have been expanded to five days per week. The program joins with the Family Resource Facilitator and math and reading staff developers to support Family Math Night and Family Reading Night structured to help parents learn how to help their children in fun ways, especially during vacation periods. Six clubs have been added during the recess period for third graders: Arts & Crafts, a book club, chess club, LEGO building, science club, and a computer coding club. For the past 8 years, Summit Park ES has performed in the top 2 places in both reading and math among the primary schools.

LEGAL ADVOCACY FUND (LAF)

Burhans vs. Yale update. Adopted 2015. Susan Burhans was hired by Yale University in 1999 as a communications specialist and served the University as a security education coordinator. In 2012, Burhans filed suit against Yale, alleging sex discrimination and unlawful retaliation under Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 and other laws. Burhans claims she was discriminated against and eventually terminated after years of attempting to help survivors of sexual assault on campus and alert Yale to potential Title IX violations. The suite was originally filed in 2012. Burhans filed an amended complaint in 2014.

PUBLIC POLICY

Congratulations NYS Women!!! The Women's Equality Bills have been signed by Governor Cuomo. It is time to celebrate. The Women's Equality Bills that were passed during the 2015 legislative session are now law. To get complete information on what the bills include, go to *The New, New York State Law Primer*. This webpage reviews the laws including the bill numbers, what the bill does and a downloadable one sheet. Now that these bills have been signed into law, we must spread the word, educate the public about these new rights and work for strong enforcement. And, together we will push for other reforms to ensure that women have full access and opportunity to succeed!
