STEM Engineering Conference by Amy MacDermott

The STEM Program of our AAUW Rockland Chapter organized its sixth annual Engineering Conference for Rockland County high school students on November 18, 2015. This conference was hosted in conjunction with the New York State Society of Professional Engineers, Rockland Chapter. Our AAUW branch president, Suzanne Young-Mercer, started off the conference with an introduction to AAUW and our STEM initiative. Two guest engineers followed up with talks for the students. One was an overview of engineering fields and activities, given by Megan Busch from Brooker Engineering, and the other talk, given by Dr. Gloria Books Reinish, Professor of Bioengineering from Fairleigh Dickinson University, focused on electrical engineering. After a buffet luncheon, a panel of 6 engineers took a wide range of probing questions from the attendees. The conference was well attended by over 50 students as well as some parents, guidance counselors and teachers. This program was organized by the engineering subcommittee of the STEM committee including Renee Brilliant, Chair; Bach-Tuyet Pham, Peter Arvanites, Marie Horton and Amy MacDermott.
