The law would have the effect of closing the majority of the abortion care clinics in Texas. AAUW supports choice in the determination of one's reproductive life and increased access to health care and family planning services.

### Did you know?

That **Rebecca Lee Crumpler** became the first black woman to receive an American medical degree from the New England Female Medical College in Boston in 1864.

Ida B. Wells Barnett (1862-1931) was best known for her work with the anti-lynching campaign. She began her activist work at the age of 22 after being forced from her first-class seat, in favor of a white man, on a train ride from Memphis. She became a successful journalist. In 1892, three of her friends were lynched. Wells wrote about the lynching, as a result of which white citizens burned down her newspaper office and ran her out of town. She moved to Chicago and founded numerous organizations for African American women and became involved in the suffrage movement. Along with Jane Addams, she successfully prevented Chicago from establishing segregated schools.
