Women's History Month Program

Thank you to Myrna Silberman, Sandy Masiello, Amy MacDermott and Elda Graff for another wonderful program for women's history month. Myrna sent the following press release to the Rockland news publications. Watch for it on our website with photos.

"The American Association of University Women (AAUW) Rockland County branch held their annual Women's History program at the Valley Cottage Library on Saturday, March 12, 2016 in celebration of Women's History month. This year the topic was *Women in the Military: Past, Present, and Future*. Major Shauna Hann, an instructor from West Point, spoke about the history of women in the military from Revolutionary times to the present. Captain Jessica Dawson, also an instructor from West Point, spoke about her experiences in the army. In addition, she is a contemporary fiction author who depicts the challenges that confront Veterans and their families when they return to civilian life. Captain Susan Branam, who is presently Deputy Director of the Rockland County Veteran's Service, talked primarily about her experiences as an Apache Helicopter Pilot. All three shared their experiences in a personal and meaningful way that resonated with the audience. County Legislator Harriet Cornell gave out awards of recognition from the County Legislature, and Assembly Member Ellen Jaffee gave out recognition awards from the State Assembly to the guest speakers for their service to their country."

Oh what fun it was to share our favorite authors, books and collections with students. Their "Thank you" notes were so authentic that we made a bulletin board to share our favorites.

We sponsored 3 clubs for 3rd graders this year which met on Fridays for 30 minutes from November 1 - March 31 during recess. A very special thanks to Rabia Nagin (art club), Annette McBride (book club) and the "Chess Men" Ralph Chavarria, Mark Barabell, Steve Becker and Rick Young. In addition Steve Becker made a presentation to 3rd grade classes from the garden division of Cornell Cooperative Extension.

Wednesday, March 16, 2016 was "International Math Night," 6:00 - 8:30 PM. Our stalwart planning committee Debby Frank, Sandy Gordon, Joanne Feniger and Joyce Brown prepared an exciting night to demonstrate to

parents how to help their children with math in inexpensive, fun ways and to show parents how smart their children are getting. Twenty percent of the chess players were girls who surprised their parents with their skill. Also volunteering were members and spouses of the Spring Valley Rotary and its international arm, "Schools to End Poverty," which provides financial support for Family Math Night. Thanks also to Sharon Stephenson, the Ramapo High School Honor Society and our additional RSVP volunteers. Friday, April 1 at Summit Park ES was Grand Marshal Appointment Ceremony for the Maria Fareri Children's Hospital, Westchester County, NY for Eli Whittaker, a student at the school. Eli was born at the hospital 15 weeks prematurely at 1 pound 6 ounces. His appointment heralds his successful survival. He was celebrated by his fellow first graders and the East Ramapo Marching Band with a ceremony, proclamations and a parade around the school. He will serve as Grand Marshal for the hospital's annual fund-raising marathon on May 1, 2016 in Westchester.

Tuesday, April 5th was "Mayor's Day of Recognition for National Service" celebrated at Summit Park Elementary School with a luncheon hosted by RSVP and Foster Grandparent Volunteers of Rockland County. LEGAL ADVOCACY FUND (LAF)

NYS State Legal Advocacy Fund Director Nancy Mion reports the following:

"The Legal Advocacy Fund, launched in 1981, has been supporting cases of sex discrimination for 35 years. During that time LAF has disbursed nearly \$2,000,000 to more than 100 plaintiffs. Before 2009, LAF only supported cases in academia, but now LAF supports select cases in any workplace. It is wonderful to report success thanks to your generous support. At the 2015 NYS Convention Michelle Jaureguito Henley shared her moving story about the results of the retaliation she received from Feather River Community College in California when she complained about sex discrimination. There is an article about the case that I wrote in the spring 2015 Focus. She and a colleague, Laurel Wartluft, filed whistleblower lawsuits alleging that the college violated Title IX. Finally after ten long years, the two women have settled their cases."

The U. S. Supreme Court vacancy created by the death of Justice Antonin Scalia has dominated the news over the last few weeks. The vacancy and President Barack Obama's nominee to fill the vacancy will be major topics in the 2016 election. AAUW LAF and public policy staff held a conference call on March 3 to discuss the politics around the nomination and the effect a vacant Supreme Court seat could have. Susan Gitt Gordon, MD (March 8, 1924 - January 25, 2016)

Dr. Gordon was our branch member and supporter of AAUW for many years. Born on International Women's Day, Dr. Gordon was a licensed and board certified pediatrician who had a distinguished career as a physician, educator and social activist. She graduated from Mount Holyoke College in 1946 and entered the Woman's Medical College, in Philadelphia, PA. She transferred to Howard University College of Medicine and received her medical degree in 1950. She married Edmund Gordon in 1948 and they moved to New York City and founded the Harriet Tubman Child Health and Guidance Clinic in Harlem. In 1954 they moved to Rockland where she had a pediatric office in Haverstraw. In 1958 she became an Associate Professor of Pediatrics at New York Medical College and then at Columbia University's College of Physicians and Surgeons where she taught for 25 years. Dr. Gordon served as a member of the National Panel on the Measurement of the Program Effects of Head Start. She served on the East Ramapo Central School District Board of Education for 8 years, 3 years as president; was a member of the Board of Trustees of Nyack Hospital; a long-standing board member of the Martin Luther King Multi-Purpose Center and president of its board of trustees. With her husband, Dr. Edmund W. Gordon, they founded the CEJJES Institute whose mission is to promote social justice, principally in relation to issues of health and education with a particular emphasis to encourage the well-being of children from marginalized communities.
