The panelist discussion was very well-received. Our panelists: Azadeh Khalili, First Executive Director of Commission on Gender Equity, Mayor Office City Hall; Pamela Abner, Chief Administrative Officer of Diversity and Inclusion, Mount Sinai Health System; Rippi K. Karda, Assistant General Counsel, Verizon Communications, Inc.; and Gabrielle Lyse Brown, Director of Diversity and Inclusion, New York City Bar Association, discussed topics relevant to understanding why we need to have a diverse and inclusive workforce, how this can be achieved and what the next steps are to ensure that this mandate continues to be the practice.

If you were not able to attend, you missed a very lively discussion, but I believe AAUW District V gained individuals with whom we can collaborate in any future endeavors.

Our speaker will be Diane Jablonski, current AAUW New York State treasurer. A graduate of the University of Delaware with a degree in Mathematics, she retired after 37 years in management at IBM and as a consultant and director for Cap Gemini Ernst and Young . In 2005, Diane ran successfully for the position of Dutchess County Comptroller. Currently she is a Commissioner of the NYS Bridge Authority and active in the Dutchess County Mediation Center, the LWV, AAUW, Dutchess Democratic Women's Caucus and her church. She has been active in training and mentoring women to run for office locally for the last 15 years.

Diane will focus her presentation on 1) the current status of elected women in New York, 2) why having women as part of the elected bodies is really important, and finally, 3) the inhibitors: what are they and why aren't more women running?

PUBLIC POLICY by Ann Mulligan

In the 2016 session of the New York State Legislature, **Paid Family Leave** was passed. This bill moves from unpaid *Family and Medical Leave* to employee-funded insurance which provides compensation when employees take family leave. This is an expansion of a previous employee benefit bill which was passed into law by Congress and President Bill Clinton in 1993. It allowed employees to take *unpaid* time off from their jobs to provide care to sick family members or newly born, or just adopted, children. There were restrictions on who qualified; however, this was the first time employees had a right to take time away from work knowing a job would be available for them when they returned to work.

Starting in 2018 New York State will lead the nation in providing income for employees while they take family leave to deal with an unexpected medical issue, care for an elderly relative, or build the bond with a new family member - newborn or adopted child. Paid Family Leave in New York State will have broad social benefits by building strong families and improving relations between children and parents, by lessening economic inequality and will help keep women in the workforce. New York is one of five states with a Paid Family Leave law and has the best employee coverage.
