L.A.F. Prince George's County, Maryland will pay civil engineer, Joanna Smith approximately \$140,000 in damages and increase her salary. Smith works for the PG County DOE and made attempts to negotiate a high salary, but was unsuccessful. The county subsequently hired men to perform a job similar to Smith's – but for higher pay. According to the supervisory trial attorney, "We filed this law suit because Prince George's County not only refused Ms. Smith's efforts to negotiate a higher salary commensurate with her experience and education, it then continually paid her less than it paid her male colleagues even though she did equal and in some cases, more complex and superior work.

PUBLIC POLICY – Choice - Paid Family Leave – Pay Equity - These are the major issues of importance to women today. The branch is seeking to establish a rapport with local elected officials to help promote our mission.

STEM –The branch received \$470.00 in grant money from the NY AAUW to underwrite our annual High School Engineering Program.

On July 31st at the invitation of Bernadette Connors, Professor of Biology at Dominican College, AAUW STEM Committee representatives Bach Tuyet Pham, Joyce Brown, and Amy MacDermott, participated in an organizational meeting to develop an authentic research experience program for high school students. Steve Burns, Professor of Chemistry at St. Thomas Aquinas College (STAC) and Dean of the School of Arts and Sciences, and representatives from the Spring Valley NAACP were also in attendance. The proposed program was initiated by Lamont Doherty (Columbia University) to expand the existing program to include local underrepresented high school students in Rockland County. The branch will be working closely with Dominican, STAC and Lamont to determine how we can further contribute to this partnership.

AAUW HISTORY - Women in Politics from Charlotte Sorger

AAUW has been advocating for women to run for political office since its founding in 1881. The practice really took hold in the 1920s, shortly after women received the right to vote. An article in the ACA Journal, November 1920, entitled "Politics as a Profession" encouraged Association members to pursue a career in politics and described the variety of positions available and why women would make ideal candidates. She underscored the positive changes women could make by becoming involved and suggested the relatively new option of studying or majoring in political science in college or university.

Throughout the following decades, AAUW leaders created and distributed lists or "rosters" of women qualified for public office to political parties and administration officials looking to appoint women.

All of this work went officially on record in 1947 at the Dallas convention when AAUW members passed a resolution in favor of "seeking out and supporting women for office."

Many women elected to Congress gained experience in leadership as AAUW members including the first woman ever elected, Rep. Jeanette Rankin (R-MT) who served in Congress from 1917-1919 and again from 1941-1943.



WELCOME HOME Peggy Whitson – Record Breaker from Doria E. Hillsman

Astronaut and bio-chemist Peggy Whitson recently returned to Earth wrapping up a record-breaking flight that catapulted her to first place for US space endurance.

Whitson's total of 655 days off the planet (288 days on this mission) exceeds any other American and any other woman worldwide. She is the oldest spacewoman (57) and most experienced female spacewalker. She is also the first woman to command the space station twice. Other astronauts on the Soyuz MS-04, launched on April 20, 2017 were cosmonaut Fyodor Yurchikhin and NASA astronaut Jack Fischer. The space craft landed in Kazakhstan early on Sunday, September 3, 2017 (Kazakhstan time).
