#### **P**resident's Message ...

On Sunday, October 1, 2017, our branch co-sponsored an event at the Pearl River Library entitled, "The ABC's of the IDC." We had the pleasure of hearing from Andrea Stewart-Cousins, NYS Senator, Westchester County and Michael Gianaris, NYS Senator of Queens/Brooklyn County. They both spoke eloquently about the actions of the IDC (Independent Democratic Conference).

For those who are not aware, the IDC is a group of eight (8) Democrats who have formed a coalition with Republicans in the Senate creating a false Republican majority. This false majority has created gridlock and has affected the passage of a myriad of legislation items which the AAUW supports. **E.O.F.** - Plans for the Annual Holiday Party are underway! Date and location are yet to be determined. **L.A.F.** - Case Update: *Burhans v. Yale.* Susan Burhans-Landino was hired by Yale University in 1999 as a Communications Specialist and served the university as a security education coordinator. She claims she was discriminated against and eventually terminated after years of attempting to help survivors of sexual assault on campus and alert Yale to potential Title IX violations. In 2012 she filed suit against Yale alleging sex discrimination and unlawful retaliation under Title IX and other laws. Her case was favorably settled in 2017 following the five-year legal battle. **MEMBERSHIP-.** If you have not renewed, please send in your dues promptly.

**PUBLIC POLICY** – The vote on whether or not to re-write the NY State Constitution comes up every 20 years and will be voted upon in the November election. Members are urged to become informed of the issues and concerns of both those who will vote "NO" and others who will approve the referendum. To date, AAUW NY has not posted a position on this issue. As in congress, the New York State Legislature meets for a biennial session so the legislation introduced in 2017 continues through 2018. Some of the legislation on AAUW issues that will be available for action includes Paid Family Leave and Pay Equity (through a legal prohibition on all questions regarding compensation from prior employers by potential employers). Please be aware that the Federal Department of Education has **revoked** the efforts of the previous administration to bring about the necessary legal reform which would hold colleges and universities responsible and accountable for investigating and prosecuting sexual assaults.

**STEM** – Our STEM program at Summit Park Elementary School officially began October 4 with a workshop and luncheon for the coaches. Fifty people enjoyed a delicious luncheon (40 coaches, 8 school support staff and others). Dr. Michael Baston, new President of Rockland Community College, was a special guest at the luncheon. He spoke of the pipeline of students from Summit Park to Harvard University by way of Rockland Community College. He looks forward to AAUW Rockland's continued association with RCC.

**WOMEN'S HISTORY-** At our Branch Meeting on November 15<sup>th</sup> at 7 PM at the Nanuet Library, Claire Sheridan from the Rockland Historical Society will speak to us about the history of the women's suffrage movement from the late 1880's to 1917, when women got the right to vote in New York. Her talk will focus on women suffragettes from Rockland County, such as Caroline Lexow Babcock. We will be celebrating the Centennial of the passage of legislation in NY granting women the right to vote – almost four (4) years before the 19<sup>th</sup> amendment! Mark Your Calendars!
