## **P**resident's Message

Greetings!

At our February 24th Diversity Brunch we discussed a wide array of legislative and other topics. Extensive legislative agenda:

-Reproductive rights and codifying Roe v. Wade

-Maternal mortality and maternal depression

—Pass ERA

-Storage of rape kits - 30 days to 5 years

—Sexual Harassment Policy

-STEM Fellowship

-Childcare and Pre-K expansion

-\*\*\*Salary History Ban and Tipped Worker Issue (AM Jaffee), also Childcare subsidies, \$100M ask: Issues we thought we would work on together\*\*\*

Other 'take aways':

-Demand parity on boards and commissions

-Study our county boards and commissions (intern activity?)

-Joint Legislative Advocacy Workshop Session

-Begin Planning for 20th anniversary brunch, incorporate HS and college students

-We must not forget to include our brothers in our efforts, it cannot be only women!

Finally, we talked about keeping the conversation going on joint activities and to start planning the 20th anniversary Diversity Brunch. One thought is to set up a monthly call, before or after work, like 8:30 on the 1st Monday of the month.

Based on our discussion, I worked with AAUW National and our State public policy VP to prepare 2-Minute Activist Emails, one budget-related asking for \$100M in Childcare allocations in the NYS Budget, and the other a legislative-related letter asking your legislators to support a Salary History Ban and elimination of the lower minimum wage for tipped workers. Below are the links for the letter. It really does just take 2 minutes to send letters to our legislative leaders for issues we support and believe in! Most especially, the state budget will be done in the next couple of days so it is important to send the childcare letters NOW!

## Text PLEDGE to 21333 to Join AAUW's Day of Action on April 10

Next week, advocates across the country will observe <u>Equal Pay Day 2018</u>, the date that symbolizes how far women must work into 2018 to bring home the same pay as men did in just 2017 alone. While the gender pay gap is nothing to celebrate, observing Equal Pay Day is a powerful way to raise

awareness about the fight for fair pay — and that's why we're calling on you to take action.

## Join AAUW on April 10 in a national Day of Action to close the gender pay gap by texting the word PLEDGE to phone number 21333 on your cell phone.

On Equal Pay Day (April 10), we'll send you a reminder text with a toll-free phone number to reach your state legislators and demand pay equity. When you use our toll-free phone line, you'll hear a simple call script before being connected directly to the office of your state legislator.

**L.A.F.** There are two new cases which AAUW Legal Advocacy supports - *Sveen v* . *Melin* and *NIFLA v. Becerra*. The stories are spelled out on the LAF Express website where you can read all about them.

LAF and AAUW have been working toward equal pay for decades. Here is one example:

*Weissman v. Albert Einstein College of* Medicine *of Yeshiva University.* Heidi Weissman was a professor of nuclear medicine who filed a sex discrimination lawsuit in the U.S. District Court for Southern New York against the Albert Einstein College of Medicine in New York for paying her substantially less than her colleagues who performed similar work. Weissmann settled in 1994 and was awarded \$900,000 in damages which is believed to be the largest -ever settlement of a medical school sex discrimination case.
