

The program will take place from 9am to 4pm, featuring both morning and afternoon sessions. AAUW-Rockland has been asked to volunteer. I will have more information on our role in this training and it will serve as our District V Conference. I would like to ensure that every young woman who wishes to is able to attend and at the very least, I would like to rent a bus to transport them from Rockland down to the City for this event. The meeting and discussion in June identified many items of interest to the members. Some of these interests will be further developed and worked upon by our Program committee. Ultimately, we hope we provide for you the members an avenue for your participation. As you identify for yourselves the answer to the questions presented above, I again welcome you to a new year and hope that you will find a way to make the branch what you want it. **L.A.F. AAUW Signs on to Two Amicus Briefs**: *Parker v. Reema Consulting Services Inc.* The US Court of Appeals will consider whether rumors that Evangeline Parker, an employee at Reema Consulting Services, Inc. was promoted by "sleeping her way to the top" are actionable. Parker alleges that she was subjected to a false and degrading rumor that she was promoted because she engaged in sexual activity with a male manager. The rumor resulted in harassment, discrimination, retaliation and ultimately, termination.

State of California et al v. Health and Human Services. AAUW supports a preliminary injunction preventing the Dept. of Health and Human Services from enforcing the "exemption rules" which allow religiously affiliated nonprofits, such as universities, hospitals, etc. to stop providing contraceptive services based on religious and moral convictions. LAF mourns the death of its founder, Katherine "Kappy" Eaton who passed away earlier this month at age 94. She was well known throughout AAUW and valued greatly within her AAUW member state of Oregon. During her longstanding commitment to the organization she served as the executive vice president of AAUW and started the Legal Advocacy Fund during the 1981 AAUW National Convention. Since then LAF has provided millions of dollars to balance the scales of justice for people working toward gender equity through the legal system. Thank you, Kappy Eaton, for your visionary leadership.

Mimi Korb Scholarship: The Mimi Korb scholarship was awarded this year in the amount of \$3000 to Chrystin Brestolli, a student at Dominican College. The Barbara Myneder Scholarship was awarded to Melinda Salvador at RCC in the amount of \$3000. Another lesser amount was given to RCC student, Brianna Carty, subsidizing her tuition and allowing her to receive the diploma she'd earned.

Public Policy: "AAUW's expectation is that our next Supreme Court justice will support the fundamental rights of all individuals and understand that his or her decisions have a very real impact on the daily lives of women and their families. After careful review of Judge Brett Kavanaugh's available record, it is clear to us that he would not be that justice. ... While we continue to urge that Judge Kavanaugh's full record be released to the American public, his available record makes clear that he stands in opposition to the values and mission of AAUW". AAUW CEO, Kimberly Churches 8/3/18 Call Senators Schumer and Gillibrand to urge them to oppose Judge Kavanaugh's confirmation.
