AAUW Reacts to Kavanaugh Confirmation

WASHINGTON — American Association of University Women (AAUW) Chief Executive Officer Kim Churches issued the following statement following the U.S. Senate's vote to confirm Judge Brett Kavanaugh as an Associate Justice to the Supreme Court.

"AAUW denounces the Senate's vote today to confirm Judge Kavanaugh to a seat on the Supreme Court. The integrity of the Court, which has the final say on the health, education, and economic security of women and girls, will be forever altered by the confirmation of a Justice rushed through a partisan process.

We have been watching this process closely and, from the very beginning, called for a full and fair vetting process for any nominee, including a careful examination of their record, qualifications, and temperament.

Judge Kavanaugh did not meet any of those standards. AAUW opposed Judge Kavanaugh's confirmation on the basis of his available record, which demonstrated his hostility to AAUW's policy priorities. When credible allegations of sexual assault surfaced, we called on the Senate to allow a comprehensive inquiry by the FBI — not the prescribed-by-politicians, time-limited, and superficial investigation that we saw. And when last week's hearing revealed Judge Kavanaugh's troubling biases, we called for his nomination to be withdrawn.

By each and every one of AAUW's standards, Judge Kavanaugh does not belong on the Supreme Court, and we are dismayed that he was confirmed by the Senate. Votes matter, and Senators should expect to continue to hear from AAUW members and supporters every day."

L.A.F. AAUW Signs on to Amicus Brief Moussouris v. Microsoft

The case is currently before the US Court of Appeals for the 9th Circuit. The case seeks to clarify Federal Procedure Rule 23 for class certification standards which limit women's ability to pursue joint action challenging systemic discrimination. The case has been brought on behalf of 8,000 both current and former Microsoft employees who have been discriminated against under Microsoft's pay and promotion systems. AAUW joined an amicus brief because, "We advocate for equitable access and advancement in employment, including vigorous enforcement of employment discrimination statutes and the right to challenge discriminatory employment practices thorough class actions." The case is not yet scheduled for oral argument. More to follow.

STEM – STEM at Summit Park is a math and reading coaching program where volunteer coaches work at least one day per week with individuals or small groups of 2 – 6 students to promote academic success. It began in the fall of 2008 with eleven math coaches. The program is a collaboration with the East Ramapo School District. Starting the first year with 3rd grade math classes and 11 coaches, the program now involves 50 plus coaches supporting grades 1-3 in reading and math. It utilizes lots of love and special low-key strategies to promote the success of students, especially girls, to enable them to successfully choose careers in the fields of **S**cience, Technology, Engineering and **M**ath.

Coaches are solicited from AAUW, RSVP, friends of coaches and other organizations with similar missions. The primary qualification is to love reading and/or math and be willing to share that love. Based on tenets of AAUW publications, "Where the Girls Are," "Under the Microscope," and "Why So Few?" as well as "Supplemental Education" by Rockland County resident, Dr. Edmund Gordon, the program seeks to provide an enjoyable entre into learning at an early age.

Coaching services are provided 5 days per week. The program joins with the school district Family Resource Facilitator and math and reading staff developers to support Family Math and Reading Nights structured to help parents learn how to help their children in fun stress- less ways, especially during vacation periods. Clubs in arts and crafts, chess, LEGO building, science, knitting, coding and book clubs are available to students during recess. Additional clubs that develop visual discrimination, creative inquiry and critical thinking will be added as staffing and facilities become available. Books that are functionally and age appropriate are given to every student in the school two to three times a year to help them to build a personal library at home. In the spring of 2018 Rosalind Maxwell, secretary and coordinator of the STEM at Summit Park, who had been with us since the idea of the program was conceived passed away. She is sorely missed. **Joyce Brown**


