Make Outreach to Local Title IX Coordinators a Branch Program



All K–12 schools and postsecondary institutions that receive federal funds must designate at least one employee to coordinate their efforts to comply with and carry out their responsibilities under <u>Title IX</u>. These Title IX coordinators ensure that all people affected by sex discrimination in schools — students, parents, and employees — are aware of their legal rights.

Some of the most egregious and harmful Title IX violations occur when schools fail to have a Title IX coordinator or when a Title IX coordinator does not have the training or authority to oversee compliance with Title IX. That's why the Department of Education issued resources for Title IX coordinators to better understand and perform their important job of ensuring that learning environments are free from sex discrimination. AAUW encourages advocates to deliver this critical resource guide to local Title IX coordinators.

With AAUW's new, interactive tool organized by state, you can now locate the contact information of the Title IX coordinators nearest to you so that you can deliver these valuable resources.

Title IX coordinators play a vital role in preventing and addressing sex-based discrimination in schools. They ensure equal opportunities in STEM and athletics, work to address sexual harassment and assault, assist pregnant and parenting students, and much more. Under federal law, every institution that receives federal funds for education programs is required to designate one employee to be responsible for ensuring the school complies with Title IX. But unfortunately, many Title IX coordinators lack a complete understanding of their responsibilities.

In 2015, the Department of Education provided resources to help coordinators understand the full scope of their jobs, but not all coordinators know about these tools. By making outreach to local K–12 schools, colleges, and universities a branch program, you can help spread the word about these valuable resources. AAUW provides a step-by-step guide to bring equity for women and girls to your community. These instructions were written with AAUW branches in mind, but they can easily be adapted for student organizations, community groups, or interested individuals looking to take action.

AAUW members and gender-equity advocates can play an important role by delivering these resources to schools in their communities and helping to support Title IX coordinators in performing their duties.

STEM – The 9th Annual AAUW- Rockland Secondary School Engineering Conference was held on November 7th at the King's Daughters Library in Garnerville. The event hosted over 120 people, including students from 10 of the county's high schools, teachers and guidance counselors and engineers who served as panel guests. County Legislator, Toney Earl honored the panelists with commendations for their service to the youth of our community and NYS Society of Professional Engineers President, Tom Broderick was on hand to discuss engineering scholarship opportunities and the upcoming Engineering Expo. Our own April Biggs, gave a presentation on the basic types of engineers and the important role that engineering plays in our everyday lives. Keynote speaker, Alixandria Lane from Turner Construction Corporation gave a very interesting account of her work as lead engineer in the excavation phase of the 3 billion-dollar Hudson Yards Project and her work on the Penn Station renovation for which she won an award for design. Students had a delicious catered lunch, participated in an interactive contest, (Tappan Zee High School won



the first place trophy) and left with packets of information on engineering schools, scholarships, jobs and salaries. A diverse panel consisted of engineers from Brooker Engineering, McLaren Engineering, Turner Construction Corporation and Lilker Engineering Associates and provided a very rich and informative dialogue about their respective and collective experiences and backgrounds. 
