We would like to announce that the AAUW-NYS board met in November and approved to initiate a one-year NYS dues waiver. Therefore, we are sharing our savings with you, our dedicated members. This means that every member of AAUW-NYS will not pay the \$13 to the state for dues this upcoming fiscal year starting in March. The covered timeframe will be from July 1, 2021-June 30, 2022 for the waiver. This decision has no impact on what vour local branch decides to do to offset the dues increase. The dues waiver is the State's effort to help branches and members during this difficult time, and in light of the announcement of the National dues increase.

The State will carry on as always, including providing grants and assistance as needed to the branches.


