This month's Member Spotlight is on... Sylvia Miller



Born and raised in the Finger Lakes area of New York State (beautiful country). Graduated from St. Lawrence University with a BA in English. Enjoyed 4 delightful years there studying and participating in music and drama. Upon graduation, moved to Manhattan to start a job as health underwriter with MONY (Mutual of New York insurance company.) One day I had an unpleasant experience with my department manager who took me aside into a private office and screamed at me that he didn't like me. Nothing about my work ethic, just that he didn't like me. His face turned so red I feared he might have a stroke. Then he dismissed me and we went back to our respective desks. I was furious! The next day I submitted my resignation to personnel who asked my reason for leaving. I told them my story and they found me a much better job in the company as secretary in the regional office. Loved that job.

Meanwhile I had married George Miller (who worked for CBS TV news) and we enjoyed several years living in Manhattan with our two little daughters. Central Park was their playground. In time we moved to Rockland County for the excellent school system in Clarkstown at that time. I was an at-home mom for several years before returning to the work force, again as a secretary for a small Norwegian-owned pharmaceutical company in Ft. Lee, NJ. I spent the next 20 years with that company advancing from secretary to customer service manager to become the first woman product manager in the marketing department. This was a very fulfilling 20 years including many trips to Norway.

Meanwhile, our daughters have grown up, married and started families. Now there are 8 grandchildren and they are all growing up, some already graduating college and making their way in the world. Quality time spent with them.

Back in 1990, an ad in the local paper announcing an AAUW branch meeting changed my life, didn't it? My involvement began after my retirement in 1996. Since then, I have been corresponding secretary, treasurer, newsletter editor (thank you Doria for taking over this job), directory coordinator and Communications Chair, attended numerous Summer Leadership conferences and annual state conventions along with being a member of numerous committees while also being involved in the Rockland Sierra Club, League of Women Voters, AARP, gym classes, church deacon and choir member and Clarkstown Dem. Committee member.

OUR JUNE BRANCH MEETING...

Many feel that the most urgent issue of our time is the climate crisis. One report after another from the UN Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) has warned the world that there is very limited time to avoid irreversible runaway climate change.

The question is, what can we do that will make a measurable difference? What are the most effective measures - and fast enough? The most powerful steps are those we take as a community.

An innovative new clean energy program in Rockland County offers a powerful climate action, helping communities quickly make the transition to clean, renewable energy and off polluting fossil fuels, while also helping to avoid rate increases.

Five Rockland communities are currently participating: Clarkstown, Orangetown, and the Villages of Haverstraw, Nyack, and Upper Nyack. Five new communities are planning to join the program this year: Suffern, Montebello, Piermont, Grand View-On-Hudson, and West Haverstraw. Two-thirds of Westchester communities are participating in a similar program.
