## This month's Member Spotlight is on...

## Frances Riley Blauvelt

### Who is Frances Riley Blauvelt?

There are so many ways I can define myself. To begin with, I was defined by my parents. On my father's side I was a third generation California native, descended from an English Irish gold seeking "49er," as well as from 18<sup>th</sup> century English colonists. On my mother's side I descended from 19<sup>th</sup> century Czech immigrants. Genealogy and history were always interesting to me, so when I married a man who descended from the earliest founders of New Amsterdam, we both became active genealogists and historians of the Association of Blauvelt Descendants for many years.



Both my parents were teachers and quite musical. My father especially wanted me as his oldest daughter to be a musician. He taught me to play "Hot Cross Buns" on the piano at age three. We lived in San Francisco, and I planned to be a high school music teacher like him. However, I had also caught the performance bug. I graduated cum laude from San Francisco State, with elementary and secondary music teaching licenses. After a very short time teaching, I moved to New York City in 1961 to study singing at Juilliard. I needed to find out if I was capable of a singing career.

I didn't know that this move would change my life forever. Except for a family from my former church now living in Pearl River, I was completely on my own. I had to grow up fast. My experiences at Juilliard proved to me that I was capable of being a professional singer, but not enough to support myself. A favorite saying was, "A Juilliard diploma and a token will get you a ride on the subway." My experience as a teacher helped me substitute, rather than having to resort to waiting on tables. I found a full-time job in a Jr. High as a Science Lab Assistant (yes, I was totally unqualified) which allowed me to have my own apartment and get my MA at NYU in Performance.

By now, in 1972, I met my future husband, a PhD student in Composition at SUNY Buffalo. I chose to go back to my original career as an elementary school music teacher in Pittsfield, MA. Ralph Blauvelt followed me, and we were married there. The next move was to Utrecht, Netherlands, where Ralph studied computer music composing. I became pregnant, and we were running out of money. We returned to Spring Valley and have lived here ever since. We discovered that our daughter, Collette was deaf, so that defined the next part of our life. Once Colette was in school, I returned to subbing in music, from Kindergarten to High School. Ralph taught Music History at RCC for many years. Fortunately, we've had lots of opportunities to perform, as long as we didn't expect to be paid! We both continued to teach privately until the pandemic. So, who is Frances Riley Blauvelt? I'm still figuring it out!

#### **Absentee Ballot Information**

\* October 24, 2022 is the last day for the Rockland Board of Elections to receive an application, letter, fax, email or absentee online portal request for the November 8 General Election ballot.

\*November 7 is the last day for an applicant or agent to apply in person at the Board of Elections for the November General Election absentee ballot.

\*November 8 is the last day to postmark the General Election absentee ballot by mail. The ballot must be received by the Board of Elections no later than November 15 (7 days).

November 8 is the last day to deliver the General Election absentee ballot in person to the Board of Elections or at any poll site throughout the county, by the close of the polls on election day.
