

### In Memory of Joyce C. Brown

Joyce Brown was born in Washington DC, graduated from Howard University with a degree in Fine Arts. She taught music in the public schools of Baltimore County, MD. She later married Warner Brown, Jr., and had two children, son Warner III and daughter Holly. The family moved to the Bronx. Joyce taught preschool followed by teaching music at JHS 127, Stevenson High School, South Bronx High School and Evander Childs High School; where she taught English, Music, African American History and Honors Humanities.

She earned a Master's degree in Secondary School Administration and then two subsequent graduate degrees at Manhattan College and the College of New Rochelle simultaneously. Joyce became Supervisor of Special Education at JHS 127, then JHS 85 before returning to the high school level as the Alternative High School Superintendent from which she retired in 2001. As Director of Christian Education at Laconia Community Presbyterian Church, ever the acceptor of a challenge, Joyce managed three boys' basketball teams which grew from the biggest losers, with no wins to first place for Pee Wees and Seniors – all within three years.

Since moving to Rockland, she has been active as a board member of the League of Women Voters of Rockland County, the Statewide Senior Action Council, the New York Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., the CASS program at Rockland Community College, the Martin Luther King Jr. Multipurpose Center, and served as the chair of the Spring Valley Rotary scholarship committee and RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Award). Joyce joined AAUW Rockland Branch 2002. She served as AAUW Rockland Branch President 2004 - 2008 and 2013 - 2015. AAUW NY State Diversity Director 2007.

Joyce travelled to Vietnam with nearly 30 other Rotary members and friends as part of the international arm of the club STEP (Schools to End Poverty). She described the experience as life changing. In 2010, Joyce was honored by the Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. Tau Gamma Zeta Chapter with their Pearl of Excellence award. Joyce was also honored by the Spring Valley Rotary as one of their Woman Warriors. In 2007, Joyce founded the STEM Tutoring Program at Summit Park Elementary School, bringing together many caring community members which offered academic enrichment to elementary students. With this initiative, Joyce bridged partnerships with Summit Park and Grace Cornerstone Church and the Nanuet Barnes & Noble where management committed to donating books, supplies and materials for the students. Her daughter, Holly Brown once said that Joyce's belief in AAUW's mission was the catalyst for her ambitious drive to bring science, technology, engineering and math education to our young people.

In 2009, Joyce received the AAUW NY State Lifetime Achievement Award for the dramatic growth of the Branch's membership and programs. Joyce was single-handedly responsible for recruiting many, many of the Branch's members. She was awarded the AAUW Rockland Woman of Achievement Award in 2015. Gerri Zabusky, former Director of RSVP, says that during the years of 2007 - 2015, Joyce as an RSVP volunteer served an astonishing 5,216 hours of service.

Joyce transitioned after a brief illness on February 9, 2023. She will be dearly missed by everyone who had the pleasure to know and work with her and by all of the children whose lives she so graciously touched.
