Becoming a member of AAUW was a something that melded all of my interests...education, voter rights, advancement of women, etc. It was the first time that I felt my combined interests and passions were all served in one place. I felt at home with women who in their own right were equally as passionate in what I wanted to advocate.

I studied Political Science/History at SUNY Albany and then received a Masters of Public Administration from Pennsylvania State University. But alas as all well-made plans go, my life took a diversion. I ended up in the computer/IT field for 50 years along with a part-time business of doing resumes (which I am still engaged in). Along the way, I found myself not only creating and monitoring computer systems, but teaching people how to use them. Then because I have a deep love for history, I tutored high school history for 20 of those years.

I later became an ESL teacher and a literacy volunteer. For many years (12), I was a girl scout troop leader and assisted with planning for local events. I was also youth group coordinator for 20 years. But all of those educational leanings and activities were not enough, so I became active in environmental protection groups, political groups, women's rights, and voting, holding a strong belief that democracy is only maintained in being an informed and active voter and by being active and using one's voice (both through voting and group activities) to make a difference in the community at large.

Margaret Meade once said, "Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful committed individuals can change the world. In fact, it's the only thing that ever has." I intend to continue to make each day count and being a part of AAUW helps me to know that I belong to an organization that is committed to this belief as well.


